

Roe v. Wade has been overturned. So what's a Christian to do now??

1. Prayise before engaging in conversations. Our focus on the attributes of God for almost three years has surely prepared us for such a time as this. 49 years of prayers/praise/tears/crying out answered. Ask, "Is God leading us to speak at all?" Is He reminding us to make sure our response is spoken in love? There is a lot being said by Biden, Warren, Jane's Revenge and others; should we "Wait on the Lord?"

2. Love pregnant women and post-abortive women. This includes praying for women (whether pregnant, post-abortive, or simply needing support) to know that they are loved by God, by CPC and by the church body.

3. Focus. Remember, **The Place of Refuge** was a vision from God. In HIS time, it brought about adoption, professional counseling, adolescent parenting and STI testing. Many of the proactive concerns that post Roe v. Wade will bring about.



4. Honor God. The story of **SO MUCH MORE (SMM)** and the limitless opportunities it provides are unique. CPC is better equipped and blessed to handle post Roe v Wade than we were prior to God's fulfilled vision of SMM. God's leading to build that facility last year was with HIS wisdom, understanding

and knowledge being handed down to us. God's provision supports mothers/dads/babies for as long as they need us to come alongside of them.



5. Donate. The opportunity to give is greater than ever. It will come from donors who see that their prayers have been answered. Hallelujah. If you are a PARTNER with this ministry and haven't put your money where your speech is, "now is the day of salvation."

6. Share about the CPC's post-abortive study for men & women who have been a part of an abortion experience. God's mercy and freedom are available, but people need to know about it before they can experience it.

7. Fasting. Jesus was present in the moment for the dad whose child was in need of deliverance. In order for us to meet the pressing needs of our clients we too will need to hear Jesus saying to 21st century post Roe disciples, "These things come about by prayer and fasting."

8. Giving. We are simply conduits of God's blessings. We are called to be good stewards of all He has given us. As in the past we will keep on trying to out-give God.



9. Wisdom. How do we overcome? By "the word of our testimony and the blood of the Lamb." Still old school enough to believe the Word is true.

10. Fear. Covid 19 did a number on the body of Christ. Most surprising has been how believers have allowed the Evil One to separate them from the assembling with other brothers and sisters. We are encouraged in Scripture 365 times, "Do not fear." We Press On.

12. Ekklesia: The called out ones. Let's be who God called us to be. Foster parenting, Adoption, volunteering, being a liaison, the opportunities are endless. As the Church, we stood by and allowed Roe. V Wade to stand for 49 years, now our role in the church is to step up and be the hands and feet of our Savior—Jesus.
